CALL FOR ACTION: Protect the County-wide Organics Program

We at Sonoma Compost Company ask that the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors, the Cities of Sonoma County, and the Sonoma County Waste Management Agency (SCWMA) take and support the following actions:

- (1) That the County and SCWMA (and Republic Services, if divestiture proceeds) extend the current Organics Processing agreement with Sonoma Compost to operate at the current site until a new compost facility (whether at the Central Landfill site or elsewhere) is permitted and operational.
- (2) That the County and SCWMA (and Republic Services, if divestiture proceeds) continue working with Sonoma Compost to identify a new compost site at the Central Landfill, with Sonoma Compost assisting by promptly updating the expiring Report of Compost Site Information (RCSI) revisions for a new site.
- (3) That the County remove provisions from the proposed divestiture agreement documents which grant Republic Services exclusive right of first refusal for food waste composting.
- (4) That SCWMA's successful organic program be continued, including the requirement that all source-separated wood and yard debris received at transfer stations and the Central Landfill be diverted to the Organics Processing site of SCWMA operated by Sonoma Compost.
